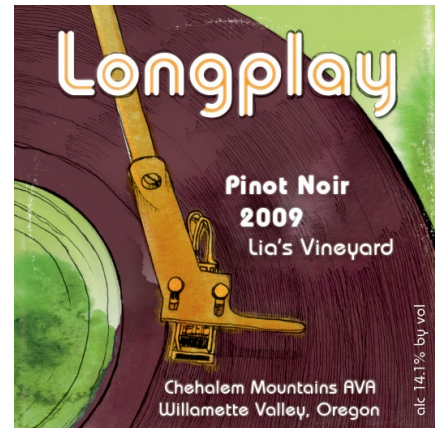
Alcohol by volume: 14.5 percent (up from 14.1 when labels were printed)

Cellar: Spontaneous fermentation in two-ton jacketed stainless tanks after 14-17 days cold-soak. Total skin contact of 23-28 days. Nine months in French oak, 20 percent new.

We've said wine is like music. There are many different genres and styles. And "best" is more a question of taste than absolutes. We craft authentic wines with character that reward those with the patience to explore a wine and watch it develop and change as the evening unfolds.

Our 2009 Lia's Vineyard Pinot Noir highlights fruit from our 115 clone which always has a wonderful pie cherry flavor and distinctive floral nose. Aromas of baking spice, bing cherry and a hint of fennel on the nose, On the palate the ripe fruit has a succulent exuberance with bright candy notes. The finish is warm, spicy and lingering with a nice hint of grip.

The wine reminds of us our favorite late 70s rock: That period was all about the lead guitar, and this vintage is all about the fruit.

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
